We have found (see table) that the ratio of applicants to places varies substantially over the United Kingdom. While it would be a gross oversimplification to assume that it was necessarily easier to gain admission to a university with relatively few applications—such as Cambridge—than to a medical school with a relatively large number—such as University College—nevertheless, when both the minimum target and the relative number of applications are taken
