- A reference from an academic member of staff at your current medical school who is able to comment on your suitability for the programmes for which you have applied.

- A personal statement for your two programme choices. There is a dedicated section on the Intercalated BSc Application Form for you to insert your statements. This is an opportunity for you to explain your motivation to study your chosen programme and describe how it relates to you academic interests and future career goals.
- Confirmation from your home institution that they are happy to release you for this period
 of study. We are happy to accept this directly via email from an official institutional

- A completed Disability and Ethnic Origin Monitoring Form
